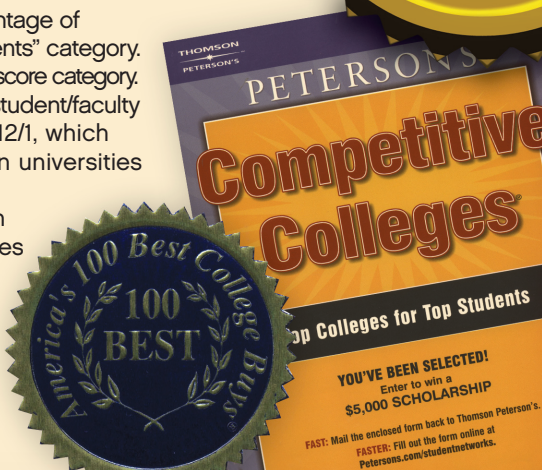

See if what's inside Union matches your expectations.

For the 10th consecutive year, Union University is ranked as a top-tier school by U.S. News & World Report. In this year's rankings, Union scored higher than ever before among southern master's universities:

- A ranking of third in the "faculty resources" category, which measures such components as the number of classes with fewer than 20 students, faculty salary and the proportion of professors with the highest degree in their fields.
- A ranking of fourth in the "percentage of classes with fewer than 20 students" category.
- Union tied for fourth in the SAT/ACT score category.
- Union tied for fifth place in the "student/faculty ratio" category, with a ratio of 12/1, which placed it in the top 18 southern universities in that category.
- Union tied for seventh place in "selectivity rank," which measures such areas as test scores and class rank for incoming students.
- Union tied for ninth place in the "freshmen in top 25 percent of high school class" ranking.

Union University at a glance

Location: Jackson, Tennessee (area population: 100,000), 80 miles east of Memphis and 120 miles west of Nashville.

Student Body: More than 3,100 undergraduate and graduate students from more than 40 states and 35 countries.

Student to Faculty Ratio: 12:1.

Percentage of Faculty with Highest Possible Degree in Field: 83%

Emphasis: A private, four-year, coeducational liberal arts-based university offering bachelors, masters and doctoral degrees.

History: Founded in 1823, Union is the oldest institution affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention.

Campus: Union is located on a 290-acre campus in north Jackson. Academic facilities include the 225,000 square-foot Penick Academic Complex, the 30,000 square-foot Blasingame Academic Complex and two recently constructed buildings and, Jennings Hall and Hammons Hall. Residential / student facilities include commons buildings, a 52,000 square-foot student union building and men's and women's apartment villages—all with private bedrooms, and a new athletic field house. Construction is near completion on White Hall, a 63,000 square-foot science building.

Athletics: Union offers scholarships for 12 varsity squads at the NAIA Division I level, including baseball (men), basketball (men and women), cheerleading (women), cross country (men and women), golf (men), soccer (men and women), softball (women) and volleyball (women). Union also hosts an extensive intramural program and provides fitness opportunities for all students.
