

Early Childhood Institute

May 16 & May 30-June 3

This course examines child development theory and current research related to curriculum, behavior, and assessment as pertaining to pre-kindergarten age children. Enrollment is limited to teachers who want to add-on the PreK-3 endorsement to a current K-6 or K-8 license. Minimum scores on the designated Praxis II tests must be acquired to complete the additional endorsement. Pre-meeting May 16 required.

Classroom Management Strategies

June 6 & June 20-24

This workshop will include a study of classroom management strategies which will center on interpersonal relationships, classroom organization and management, instruction, problem solving, behavior, and school-wide discipline. Pre-meeting June 6 required.

Celebrating Children’s Literature

June 13 & June 27-July 1

This workshop will celebrate the wonderful world of children’s literature as we explore old and new favorites, Caldecott Medal winners, Coretta Scott King Award winners, and others. Participants will discover new materials and develop strategies which will enable them to use children’s literature across the curriculum and grade levels. Pre-meeting June 13 required.

Reading/Comprehension Strategies

June 13-June 17 & June 27

Best practice reading and comprehension strategies for all students! Workshop participants will explore research-based active strategies that facilitate the construction of meaning from print. These strategies are appropriate for the stages of the reading process: pre-reading, during-reading, and post-reading. Post-meeting June 27 required.

Learning and the Brain

June 27 & July 11-15

How should we teach in order to receive maximum response from the human brain? Brain research and its implications have created a new day for teaching and learning. Teachers and administrators must consider this new knowledge if we are to promote equity and excellence for all children. This workshop will explore this exciting realm of knowledge along with strategies which reshape classroom practice as they maximize student learning. Pre-meeting June 27 required.

Stress Management for Classroom Teachers

May 23 & June 6-10

Teaching is one of the most demanding and vital jobs, and the demands of teaching are very stressful. In this workshop you will examine your stressors and how they affect you. You will explore better ways of coping and practice many stress management techniques. You will come away with new insights and an arsenal of tools to improve every aspect of your life through effective stress management. Pre-meeting May 23 required.

Green Chemistry Laboratory Workshop

June 13-17 & June 27

This hands-on workshop will explore the use of inviting green chemistry experiments as implemented in a typical first year high school chemistry course. Teachers will investigate environmentally friendly experiments as presented in *The Green Chemistry Laboratory Manual*. These experiments reduce the quantity of hazardous materials used and eliminate the need for hazardous waste disposal. Concepts explored through the presented laboratory experiments include physical properties, physical and chemical changes, thermodynamics, electron configuration and the electromagnetic spectrum, chemical bonding, polarity, solubility and qualitative tests, the mole, trends of the periodic table, stoichiometry, gas laws, and acids and bases. GRADUATE DEGREES IN EDUCATION UNION UNIVERSITY

Master of Arts in Education M.A.Ed.

A traditional master's degree composed of required core, concentration component, and education electives. May incorporate post-baccalaureate teacher licensure or add-on endorsement. Non-Thesis Option: 39 hours; Thesis Option: 33 hours.

Master of Education M.Ed.

A premier master's degree for licensed classroom teachers that stresses the practical application of the structured program of 30 semester hours designed for cohorts of 24 fellow teachers. Completed in 14 months in a unique schedule utilizing Saturdays during your school year.

Education Specialist Degree Ed.S.

An advanced graduate degree in Educational Leadership for the purpose of preparing school leaders. Offered along two tracks: (1) Administration and Supervision, a licensure track designed to prepare school principals and supervisors of instruction; and (2) Curriculum and Supervision, a non-licensure track designed for school leaders who desire knowledge of concepts and strategies for school and classroom leadership. The 39-hour program begins in February each year and is offered in the cohort delivery system primarily on Saturdays during the school year with some evenings utilized during the summers.

Doctor of Education Ed.D.

A doctoral program designed to prepare instructional leaders, the Ed.D. blends theory, research, scholarly inquiry, and best practice. It is composed of the degree requirements for the Ed.S. Degree plus a Research Dissertation Component.
