

DUAL DEGREE NURSING PROGRAM

Nursing is an appropriate choice for individuals who desire a career that will allow them to make a difference in the lives of others.

As you position yourself for a career in nursing for the 21st Century, you will want to have the best training available. This is possible through a dual degree program at Blue Mountain College and Union University.

In a caring atmosphere where faith is nurtured, in small classes and through talented faculty, you will be able to reach your professional goals.

You may choose to earn a major in either biology/chemistry, natural science, psychology, or social science at Blue Mountain College and a major in Nursing at Union University.

The Blue Mountain College Dual Degree Program is designed to allow the graduate to not only have a career in Nursing but to be prepared for a second career.

Blue Mountain College and Union University have entered into a consortial arrangement to offer students a unique program in nursing.

The Dual Degree Program allows a student to earn the core courses and a major of 30+ hours, depending on the major of choice, at Blue Mountain College (BMC) in three years.

After the transfer of courses from BMC to Union University, the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree requires two additional years to complete.

During each semester of study at Union University, selected courses are transferred back to BMC, enabling a student to complete degree requirements at BMC. After successfully completing the five years of study, a student will earn a Bachelor of Science degree from BMC and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Union University.

BMC students who meet all admission criteria are not placed on a waiting list at Union University. They are admitted immediately upon meeting all requirements.

Benefits of the Dual Degree Program are long term and lay the groundwork for Nursing Administration. The BSN curriculum provides the professional knowledge and clinical experience to prepare you for success in a variety of health care environments. It will also provides the foundation for future specialized graduate studies.

Admission Criteria for the BS/BSN at Blue Mountain College and Union University include:

- Minimum ACT of 20
- Minimum GPA of 2.5 in core requirement courses
- Grades of "C" or higher for all prerequisite natural science, social science, math, and English courses
