Terms and Conditions

PAYMENT: A deposit of \$600 per person is required for booking. Full payment is due upon receipt of final invoice, approximately 12 weeks prior to departure (mid-June). **PLEASE NOTE THAT FAILURE TO SUBMIT FINAL PAYMENT BY DUE DATE WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC CANCELLATION OF YOUR CRUISE BY HOLLAND AMERICA.**

NOT INCLUDED: Gratuities (\$11.50 per day on cruise, collected aboard ship; \$30 for land services, collected in advance for guides, bus driver, transfer assistants, etc.); any Holland America fuel surcharge; cabin upgrades on cruise (\$180 per person for oceanview with porthole window on Main Deck; \$240 per person for oceanview cabin with picture window on Main Deck; \$300 per person for oceanview cabin with picture window on Lower Promenade Deck); single room/cabin supplement; passport fees; excess baggage and forwarding of baggage; meals not listed as being included; after lunch and dinner beverages; items of a personal nature such as laundry; travel protection plan; and any item not herein listed as being included.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS: Airfare from Memphis included in the cruise price. Holland America offers low air fare add-ons from most major U.S. cities; Dehoney Travel will help book flights from hometown departure city upon request if needed. If making your own air arrangements, please book a departure flight from Montreal that departs after 12:00pm on September 22 in order to utilize the group's transfer to the airport.

DINING: First seating is requested for all passengers unless Dehoney Travel, Inc. is notified to the contrary. Because Holland America processes dining requests in the order in which they are received, dining requests are not guaranteed. All meals aboard ship are included.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTATION: A current passport is required for this cruise.

CHANGES: A \$100 service fee will be charged for changes made to existing tours within 90 days of departure. Changes of departure date or tour are considered a cancellation and a new booking. The service fee will not be assessed when upgrading cruise accommodations.

CANCELLATION: In event of cancellation, there will be a fee of \$100 for Dehoney Travel, Inc. to cover administrative costs. In addition, without protection as outlined below, cancellations made from 95-80 days prior

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to departure will be charged the amount of \$300. Within 79-62 days prior to departure, \$800. Within 61-34 days prior, 50% of the total tour cost, (including air add-on and tax) will be assessed. Within 33-21 days prior, 75% of the total tour cost, (including air add-on and tax) will be assessed; within 20 days to day of departure/no show, entire tour cost is non-refundable. Any trip interruption due to illness, accident or family emergency is subject to 100% of the unused balance of the total tour cost. **Cancellation notification must be made in writing to Dehoney Travel. Please allow up to four weeks for cancellation refund processing.**

AIR TICKETS: Air tickets will be subject to cancellation/re-booking penalties. The cost of any cancellation or changes made once the ticket has been issued will be charged to the passenger. Special requests are subject to a deviation fee by the air department. **After ticketing of international air, a cancellation penalty of 100% of the air fare is in effect. On or after the date of departure there can be no refund for any service not used.**

Holland America reserves the right to cancel any scheduled tour prior to departure. In the event that this should occur after final payment has been received by Holland America, all payments will be refunded in full. Holland America reserves the right to use alternate means of transportation when tour passenger numbers warrant such substitution and also reserves the right to change show performances when not available.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: As many U.S. health carriers do not provide benefits while outside the country and cancellation penalties can be substantial for many tours, Dehoney Travel, Inc. offers a Travel Protection Plan, TripCare, through Allianz (formerly Access America). **The Option to Waive Pre-existing Condition Exclusion requires purchase of Travel Protection within 14 days of deposit. You may decline the Travel Protection Plan, but a signed disclaimer is required and all charges for cancellation or medical treatment/transport while traveling are your responsibility.**

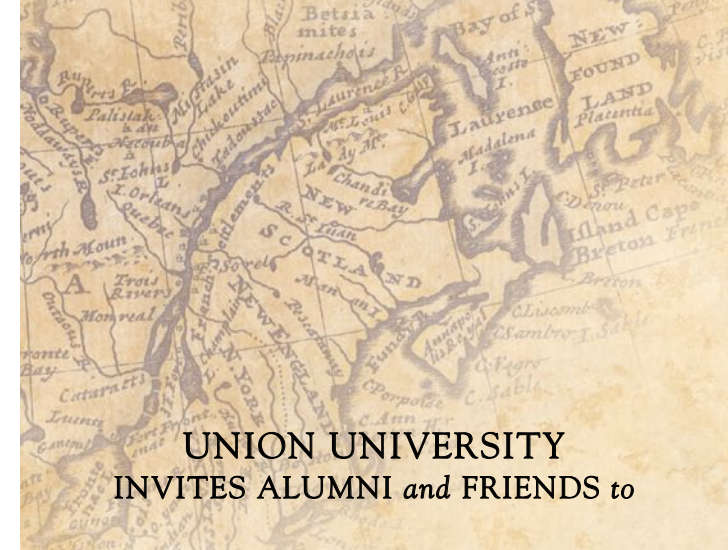

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Day 1, Fri, Sep 14 - Memphis/Boston

Today we fly to Boston. Upon arrival we are met at the airport and transferred to our centrally-located hotel. Dinner is included this evening. (D)

Day 2, Sat, Sep 15 - Boston/cruise embark PM

We enjoy a half-day city tour this morning to see some of Boston's most famous sites, such as the golden-domed State House, Boston Common, the historic North End, and Quincy Market.

Early this afternoon we transfer to the pier to board the *ms Maasdam*. We sail at 5 p.m., with dinner served on board. (B,D)

Day 3, Sun, Sep 16

Bar Harbor, Maine, 7 a.m./3 p.m.

Once the exclusive summer resort of America's fabulously wealthy, today Bar Harbor is an artists' enclave and gateway to the rich natural beauty of Acadia National Park, much of which was donated by the Rockefeller family. You may choose an optional excursion to watch for white-tail deer and other wildlife as you enjoy a horse-drawn carriage ride through the park. *Sample shore excursions: Acadia National Park & Carriage Ride; Coastal Sea Kayaking; The Ultimate Island Experience - A Private Luncheon at Frenchman's Bay.* (B,L,D)



Day 4, Mon, Sep 17

Halifax, Nova Scotia, 8 a.m./5 p.m., shore excursion included

For ocean scenery at its best, nothing rivals Nova Scotia's south shore. Halifax is the largest city east of Montreal and the capital of Nova Scotia. Today we are met at the pier and taken on a city tour of Halifax, founded in 1749 to protect British interests in North America and steeped in maritime history. Leaving Halifax, we enjoy a 45-minute drive along the scenic coastal route to Peggy's Cove, one of Canada's most visited places: Peggy's Point Lighthouse. Return to our ship this afternoon. (B,D)

Day 5, Tue, Sep 18 - Sydney, Nova Scotia, 10 a.m./5 p.m.

A hundred thousand Gaelic welcomes await you in Nova Scotia, Latin for "New Scotland." Take an optional shore excursion to visit highland villages, explore the scenic Cabot Trail, sail on golden inland seas, or inspect the Fortress of Louisbourg - where every barn, barracks and pipe and drum corps appears just as it did when King Louis' troops occupied the site in 1744. *Sample shore excursions: The Bras d'Or Lakes Grand Tour; Fortress of Louisbourg; Black Gold - Cape Breton Mine Experience.* (B,L,D)

Day 6, Wed, Sep 19 - Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, 8 a.m./5 p.m.

PEI may be Canada's smallest province, but it's big on history and attractions. It is here that the famous Conference of 1864 was held, which resulted in the creation of the Canadian confederacy. Learn all about it on an optional walking tour of Charlottetown, the provincial capital. Or cast your vote for shopping, a lobster luncheon at Dalvay-by-the-Sea or a tour of the

picturesque farm that inspired Anne of Green Gables. (B,L,D)



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Day 7, Thu, Sep 20

cruising Gulf of St. Lawrence

The largest estuary in the world, the Gulf of Saint Lawrence fringes the shores of half the provinces of Canada and is a gateway to the interior of the entire North American continent. Geographically, the Gulf is defined by stunning coast line and beautiful islands, including Prince Edward Island and the Magdalen Islands. Thousands of migratory birds make this area their home during the spring and fall migration period. And be sure to keep an eye out for whale, porpoise and seal sightings. (B,L,D)

Day 8, Fri, Sep 21 - Québec City, Québec, 7 a.m./5 p.m., shore excursion included

cruising St. Lawrence River PM

Québec is a bastion of French culture in North America where impassioned Québécois hold dear their history, language and culture. This morning we are met at the pier for a leisurely walking tour of Québec City's Lower Town. Then we ride the funicular (inclined railway) to the Upper Town where we continue our walking tour. After viewing the famous Château Frontenac, board our coach and drive to picturesque Montmorency Falls. Across from the Falls we visit Ile d'Orleans, home to many farms and famous for its produce, wineries, and

roadside stands. Later this afternoon we return to our ship. As we continue sailing along the St. Lawrence river, keep an eye out for blue, fin or beluga whales, porpoises and dolphins, and countless bird species. (B,D)

Day 9, Sat, Sep 22 - Montreal, Québec, arrive 7 a.m.

We arrive to Montreal this morning. After we disembark, we are transferred to the airport for our return flight home. (B)
