All classes meet on Mondays at Union University in Hammons Hall. Textbooks for all courses may be purchased at the campus bookstore, and seminary students have full library privileges at the Union University library.

Costs for the program are payable to The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and include: a \$35.00 application fee payable at the time the student mails his application, a \$40.00 per semester student fee, and tuition of \$158.00 per credit hour. Fees for non-Southern Baptists are \$316.00 per semester hour.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

- Course #44905** **Applied Ministry.** Approved placement of at least nine hours weekly in a ministry position with weekly individual and small group supervision. Goals and objectives as well as procedures and strategies for ministry in churches, agencies, and communities are the focus for reflective learning. Prerequisite: 40150. 2 hours
- Course #32100** **Personal Evangelism.** A study of personal evangelism designed to equip the ministry to train others in a variety of skills related to personal evangelism. This required course cannot be satisfied through transfer credit. 3 hours.
- Course #27060** **Systematic Theology I.** A careful and systematic study of Christian doctrines, covering introduction to theology, revelation and Scripture, and the existence, attributes, and triune nature of God. 3 hours.
- Course #30020** **Preaching Practicum.** Sermons by students who are preparing for a preaching ministry will be analyzed and evaluated by the instructor using live and video techniques with attention give to biblical content, organization, application, style and delivery. Prerequisite: 30000. 3 hours.
