

**Graduate Addendum: TESL 585/ICS 540
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Although you will adhere to the course plan of TESL 440 for partial credit for this course, in lieu of the research assignment for TESL 440, you will be expected to complete the following:

1. Read the following text:

Milroy, L. (1987). *Language & Social Networks*. New York: Basil Blackwell. ISBN: 0031153144.

First, you will draft at least three e-journal entries to me (every two chapters or so), exploring your engagement with the text.

Second, draft an expository piece in which you organize and present the information from the text that is significant to you. Organized around concepts, this expository piece should identify the concepts, explain them, and then demonstrate why they are significant to you in your development in your graduate program. 6-8 pages. APA documentation.

Finally, you will conduct a self-analysis of your social network, exploring in detail your network members and framing your analysis in sociolinguistic terms. You will present your analysis during the second session. More details will be available.

2. Choose a topic of your choice related to your field of study and related to this course. For example, future teachers may choose to read about second language acquisition, or culture studies students may choose to look at some aspect of sociolinguistics like linguistic imperialism. Then, collect eight valid, academic articles related to the topic, read them and compile them in an annotated bibliography. Each summary should be approximately 1 page in length. Include a two-page summary document at the beginning of the bibliography. APA documentation.
