



Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship Guidelines and Application

The Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship is awarded to students who have achieved academic success at a two year community college and are continuing in a traditional undergraduate program at Union University. Students may receive the Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship for up to four (4) semesters. Contact the Director of Student Financial Planning if your program of study at Union requires more than four semesters, to appeal for additional consideration. Students must meet the following criteria to receive this scholarship:

- Complete the Phi Theta Kappa initiation process at the institution from which they are transferring, prior to attending Union University.
- Enroll full-time at Union University in a traditional undergraduate program.
- Attend the Union University Phi Theta Kappa Alumni Association orientation and at least three chapter meetings or events each semester.
- Submit the Phi Theta Kappa scholarship application and a copy of the Phi Theta Kappa membership card, certificate or authorizing letter to the office of Student Financial Planning prior to the beginning of the semester.
- Maintain a 3.0 grade point average to renew the Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship.
