Programs of Study

College of Arts and Sciences

Actuarial science, art (ceramics/sculpture, drawing/painting, and graphic design), biblical studies, biblical studies/languages, biology, broadcasting, chemical physics, chemistry, Christian ethics, Christian studies, church history, church music, computer information systems, computer science, digital media studies (art, communication arts and computer science), engineering (electrical and mechanical), engineering physics, English (literature and writing), film studies, French (languages and culture or literature), Greek, history, honors studies, intercultural studies, journalism, mathematics, medical technology, music, music education, music management, music marketing, music performance, music theory and literature, philosophy and Christian theology, physical science, physics, political science, public relations/advertising, Spanish (languages and culture or literature), teaching English as a second language, theater/ speech, and youth ministry.

McAfee School of Business Administration

Accounting, business administration, economics/finance, international business, management, management information, and marketing. The McAfee School also offers a Bachelor of Science in organizational leadership. Business Reform magazine rates McAfee among America's top 10 faith-based business schools.

School of Education and Human Studies

Athletic coaching, athletic training, Christian ministry/recreation, family studies, health education/teacher licensure, human studies, learning foundations (K-8 or early childhood), liberal studies (middle grades 5-8), physical education/teacher licensure, psychology, secondary education (7-12), social work, sociology, special education (K-12), sport management/communication, sport management/marketing, sports medicine/ exercise wellness, and sport ministry. Union's School of Education won the 2005 Model of Excellence Award from the Association of Independent Liberal Arts Colleges for Teacher Education (AILACTE). This means Union was judged to have the best program for shaping moral and ethical teaching from among 220 private universities in the AILACTE membership.

School of Nursing

Bachelor of Science in nursing, the accelerated B.S.N. program and the RN-B.S.N. completion program. A graduate program leading to certified nurse anesthetist status will be offered beginning in spring, 2006.

Preprofessional Programs

Chiropractic, cytotechnology, dental hygiene, dentistry, health information management, medicine, occupational therapy, optometry, pharmacy, physical therapy, physician assistant studies, podiatry, and veterinary medicine.

Requirements

The requirements of each bachelor's degree awarded by Union University include 46 hours of general core curriculum, 18 to 21 hours of specific core curriculum, a minimum of 30 hours in the major academic program, and 18 hours in the

minor academic program. The completion of the required 128 hours usually requires four years with 32 hours per year.

For each undergraduate degree granted by Union University, at least 25 percent of the semester hours required for the degree must be earned through instruction at Union University. The last 56 semester hours of credit for a bachelor's degree must be earned at an accredited senior college.

Important: The priority deadline for application to Union University for fall semester 2005 is August 1.

Entrance Requirements and Deadlines

Students who are not U.S. citizens need acceptable scores on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Minimum TOEFL scores are 173 for the electronic test, and 500 for the paper-based exam. Important: When you are admitted to Union University, you will receive a form I-20. This form, your passport, financial records and proof of ties to your home country must be presented to the U.S. Embassy or Consulate in your country along with a completed Student Visa application form. Apply early enough to have a student visa in hand prior to August 22, 2005. This is the date you will need to be on campus to begin required orientation sessions for fall semester. A Private Bedroom for Every Student

One of the most positive aspects of Union's campus is student housing. Student residence halls are arranged in a village setting, with apartment-type accommodations. Each apartment suite includes a central living/ gathering room and bath, and some have kitchen facilities. Bedrooms are arranged around the living area, and every residential student receives a private bedroom at no extra cost. That gives you the privacy and quiet you need, while still being close to fellow suite-mates. Individual bedrooms are equipped with cable television and broadband Internet connections.

In addition to the apartment suites, each residence complex includes a commons building with gathering areas, laundry facilities, and other services.

In the Spotlight: Engineering

Union Engineering students major either in mechanical or electrical engineering. They choose from 26 available courses. They are expected to complete a project at the end of every engineering course to demonstrate an understanding of the material and to refine communication and design skills. Prior to graduation, students prepare for the eight-hour Engineer in Training (EIT) test, which is the first step toward becoming a licensed professional.

Engineering laboratories currently at Union include: Mechanics, thermo & fluid dynamics, electrical/electronics, control engineering, engineering computing and engineering graphics. The program began in 2001 and is expanding. Plans include additional equipment purchases and additional majors in engineering physics and industrial engineering.

Incoming students are expected to have completed the necessary requirements to begin mathematics at the level of calculus. Ideally, engineering students will have been introduced to calculus during high school. Union also requires a well-rounded course selection outside the engineering department in physical sciences, mathematics, and humanities.

Where is Union University?

Union University is located in the state of Tennessee (seen in gray) and in the city of Jackson. The campus is in the western part of Tennessee, about 120 miles west of Nashville and 80 miles east of Memphis, along Interstate Highway 40.

Nearest Airports:

- Memphis International Airport (MEM) is a 90 minute drive from campus.
- Nashville International Airport (BNA) is about a two hour drive from campus.
- McKellar Field in Jackson (MKL) serves a commuter airline and non-commercial flights.

About Jackson and Tennessee:

Nearly 100,000 people live in Jackson and Madison County. Jackson serves as the primary medical, educational, and business center for a trade area of nearly 300,000. Jackson enjoys a cost of living that is only 93 percent of the national average, and was recently ranked 7th among the 32 least-expensive market areas in the United States. It is considered one of the fastest-growing cities in Tennessee.

Despite being a small city, Jackson is home to many major corporations. Fortune 500 companies such as Procter and Gamble, Maytag, Toyota, and Delta Faucett have large facilities in the area. More information about Jackson can be found at <http://www.jacksontn.com>

The Union campus is within a short drive of internationally renowned Memphis attractions like Graceland (home of Elvis Presley), Beale Street (the self-proclaimed birthplace of Blues jazz music), and the National Civil Rights Museum. The Grand Old Opry and Country Music Hall of Fame are in Nashville. Both cities offer wide-ranging cultural opportunities and professional sports. Within a day's drive are recreational opportunities in the Ozark and Great Smoky Mountains, and Florida's beaches along the Gulf of Mexico.
