Did you know:

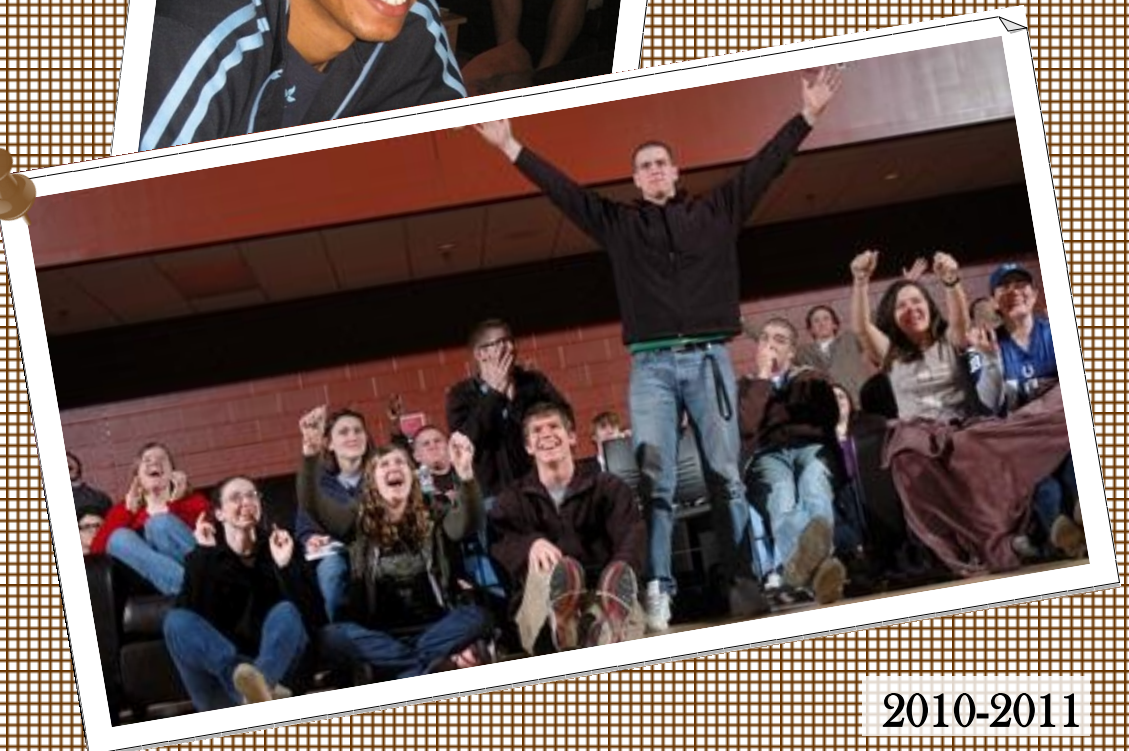
- If desired, you may loft your bed

What about the distance?

- Hope to SUB = 491 yds or 4.5 min walk
- Hurt to SUB = 344 yds or 3 min walk
- McAfee Commons to SUB = 425 yds or 4 min walk
- Hope to PAC = 700 yds or 7 min walk
- Hurt to PAC = 553 yds or 5 min walk
- McAfee Commons to PAC = 362 yds or 4 min walk
- Hope to Bowld Commons = 417 yds or 4 min walk
- Hurt to Bowld Commons = 270 yds or 2.5 min walk
- Hope to Jennings = 372 yds or 4 min walk
- Hurt to Jennings = 370 yds or 4 min walk

Important Housing Sign-Up Dates

Students must be registered for Fall classes and sign-up in groups of four to be guaranteed a Fall placement with your requested roommates. If your group drops below four, you no longer have a guaranteed placement with your roommates and the RD has discretion to make changes to your assignment. You may also go to www.uu.edu/student-services/residencelife/ and select FAQ to view more housing options or contact your RD.

April 15th - All Off-Campus Requests due in Office of Residence Life by 4:00pm.

April 20th - Students notified of approval/denial for Off-Campus Requests

April 22nd - Registration begins

- Fall/Summer Housing Sign-up forms placed in your room.

(All summer students will be placed in Grace. We anticipate full capacity for each room, therefore please contact your RD if you have any roommate questions.)

May 7th - All Housing Sign-Up forms due in either Commons.

**When turning in your housing form, please make sure that each roommate has attached their Fall schedule, then staple all forms together.*

End of June - Notification of housing assignments via UU email.

2010-2011 Housing Prices

Quad Residence Complexes:

\$3,295 for each Fall or Spring Semester

\$495 for Winter or Summer Terms

Heritage Residence Complex:

\$2,935 for Fall or Spring Semester

\$435 for Winter or Summer Terms

Warmath 1 & 2:

\$3,295 for double occupancy

\$2,935 for triple occupancy

\$495 (double) Winter or Summer Terms

\$435 (triple) Winter or Summer Terms

* All students living on-campus are required to purchase a 100 block meal plan (\$795).

Union University Living Off-Campus FAQ's Housing Contract

Each resident must sign a housing contract when checking in. Upon signing, each student is accepting the rights and responsibilities outlined in the Campus Life Handbook and Catalogue for the full academic year. This is a legal and binding document between the University and the student stating the University's rights and the student's responsibilities for a full academic year. All full-time students will be held to their lease which cannot be broken unless approved by the Director.

Living Off-Campus FAQ's

• What is the residence life policy?

Union University recognizes the experience of residential living as a valuable part of a student's education. Therefore, all students who are not 21 before September 1 are required to live on campus.

• Are there exceptions?

Students who are over 21, part time, married or living with parents will be approved to move off campus, however, they **must** complete an *Off-Campus Request* form and return it to the Office of Residence Life **by 4:00pm on April 15th**.

• Are there other situations that may be considered?

Applications from students who have a rare, extreme health condition and have a doctor's mandate for living off campus or an extreme, extenuating circumstance will be reviewed by the appeals committee. A very limited number of these situations are approved. Please attach a detailed letter to the *Off-Campus Request* form describing the specific circumstances.

• What is the process of submitting an *Off-Campus Request* form?

1. Be in good standing with the University and the Office of Student Services.

2. Obtain an *Off-Campus Request* form from the Office of Residence Life (located in the SUB) or at www.uu.edu/student-services/residencelife/resources.

3. Submit the completed request and any supporting documentation to the Office of Residence Life by **Thursday, April 15th**.

4. Wait for the Director of Residence Life and/or the Appeals Committee to review and approve/decline request. Students will be notified of the decision made by Appeals Committee via email on **Tuesday, April 20th**.

• What if I decide to apply to live off campus after April 15th?

If the request is submitted after Friday, April 15th, students who are approved to move off campus will forfeit their \$100 housing deposit. If the request is submitted after June 15th, students who are approved to move off campus will forfeit their \$100 housing deposit and be assessed a \$150 late fee.

No off campus requests will be considered for approval after August 1.
