#### Evaluation of credits

Students seeking to transfer with fewer than 24 credit hours will be designated as "Freshman Transfer" and will be required to meet all Freshman Admission Requirements. Those transferring with 24 or more credit hours must have a 2.3 cumulative GPA in order to be considered for unconditional admission Students not meeting these requirements will be referred to the Union University accepts all college level credit earned through Undergraduate Admissions Committee to be considered for conditional admission status.



- Design specifications in line with coastal Florida standards to withstand 115 MPH winds.









