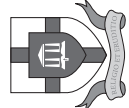

In 2008, Union will host another crucial conversation that will focus exclusively on worship.

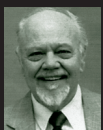
Join us February 14-16, 2008 at Union University as we consider essential questions.

Marva Dawn is a Teaching Fellow in Spiritual Theology at Regent College, Vancouver, British Columbia. She is the author of *Reaching Out Without Dumbing Down* and other books on worship.



Donald P. Hustad, is senior Professor of Church Music and Worship, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, KY. He is the author of *Jubilate II: Church Music in Worship and Renewal*, and *True Worship: Reclaiming the Wonder and Majesty*.



Robert Smith, Jr. is Professor of Christian Preaching, Beeson Divinity School, Birmingham, AL. He is a contributing editor of *Preparing for Christian Ministry* and co-editor of *A Mighty Long Journey*.



George H. Guthrie is Benjamin W. Perry Professor of Bible, Union University. He is the author of seven books, including, *The Structure of Hebrews: A Textlinguistic Analysis, Biblical Greek Exegesis* (Co-authored with J. Scott Duvall, Zondervan), the *NIV Application Commentary: Hebrews*, and *Illustrated Bible Backgrounds Commentary: Hebrews*.



David S. Dockery is President and Professor of Christian Studies, Union University. He is the author or editor of more than twenty-five books including *Renewing Minds, The Holman Bible Handbook, Biblical Interpretation Then and Now, Theologians of the Baptist Tradition* and *Shaping a Christian Worldview*.
