

# PLENARY SPEAKER D.A. CARSON

onald A. Carson is research professor of New Testament at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Deerfield, Illinois. He has been at Trinity since 1978.

Carson has been a pastor, seminary professor, a book series and journal editor, and the founding dean of the seminary



at Northwest Baptist Theological College in Vancouver.

He received the Master of Divinity degree from Central Baptist Seminary in Toronto, and the Doctor of Philosophy degree in New Testament from Cambridge University.

Dr. Carson has written or edited more than fifty books, including The Sermon on the Mount (Baker 1978), Exegetical Fallacies (Baker 1984), Matthew (Zondervan 1984), From Triumphalism to Maturity (Baker 1984), Showing the Spirit (Baker 1987), How Long, O Lord? Reflections on Suffering and Evil (Baker 1990), The Gospel According to John (Eerdmans 1991), A Call to Spiritual Reformation (Baker 1992) and Becoming Conversant with the Emerging Church (Zondervan, 2005). His book, The Gagging of God: Christianity Confronts Pluralism (Zondervan 1996), won the 1997 Evangelical Christian Publishers Association Gold Medallion Award in the category "theology and doctrine."

Dr. Carson and his wife, Joy, reside in Libertyville, Illinois. They have two children.
