- Arrange the items on your reference list alphabetically by author, interfiling books, articles, etc.
- Indent the second and following lines 5 spaces (or one half inch).
- If no author is given, start with the title.
- Abbreviate the names of all months except May, June, and July.
- If the paging of a magazine or newspaper article is not consecutive but instead is continued elsewhere in the issue, include only the first page followed by a plus sign (ex. 25+.).
