Ray Gregory skillfully works the clay on his potter's wheel. He applies even, strong pressure and molds the piece; his hands know just what to do. Soon he has a finished work.

As Gregory's hands deftly shape and fashion vessels, so Union University has shaped and fashioned him.

Gregory owns Spero Pottery in Corinth, Miss., his hometown. Spero is the Latin word for hope.

"I like the verse in the Bible speaking of God watching over the birds of the air and it reminds me of his promises and hope," Gregory says.

Entering Union as a freshman, Gregory says he did feel the promises of God. The campus was inviting, people were friendly and professors took a personal interest in him.

"The professors were very involved in each student. They helped you find your voice in whatever area you were going into," says Gregory. "I didn't realize then how blessed I was to have that."

After graduation, he spent two more years on campus working under the careful eye of professor Lee Benson. He remembers being assigned to make 250 pieces in five days of work. At week's end, Gregory and Benson picked 25 for firing and scrapped the rest.

"When I went home at night and relaxed on the couch, my hands were still moving. It broke my hands in—now, I don't think about it. I put my hands on the clay and they go to work," says Gregory.

The culling and choosing taught him not to hang on to his work—an important process in becoming a potter and artist.

"It was a pivotal lesson burned into my mind," says Gregory. "An artist wants to believe in his work, regard it highly and commit it to service, but not make an idol of it."

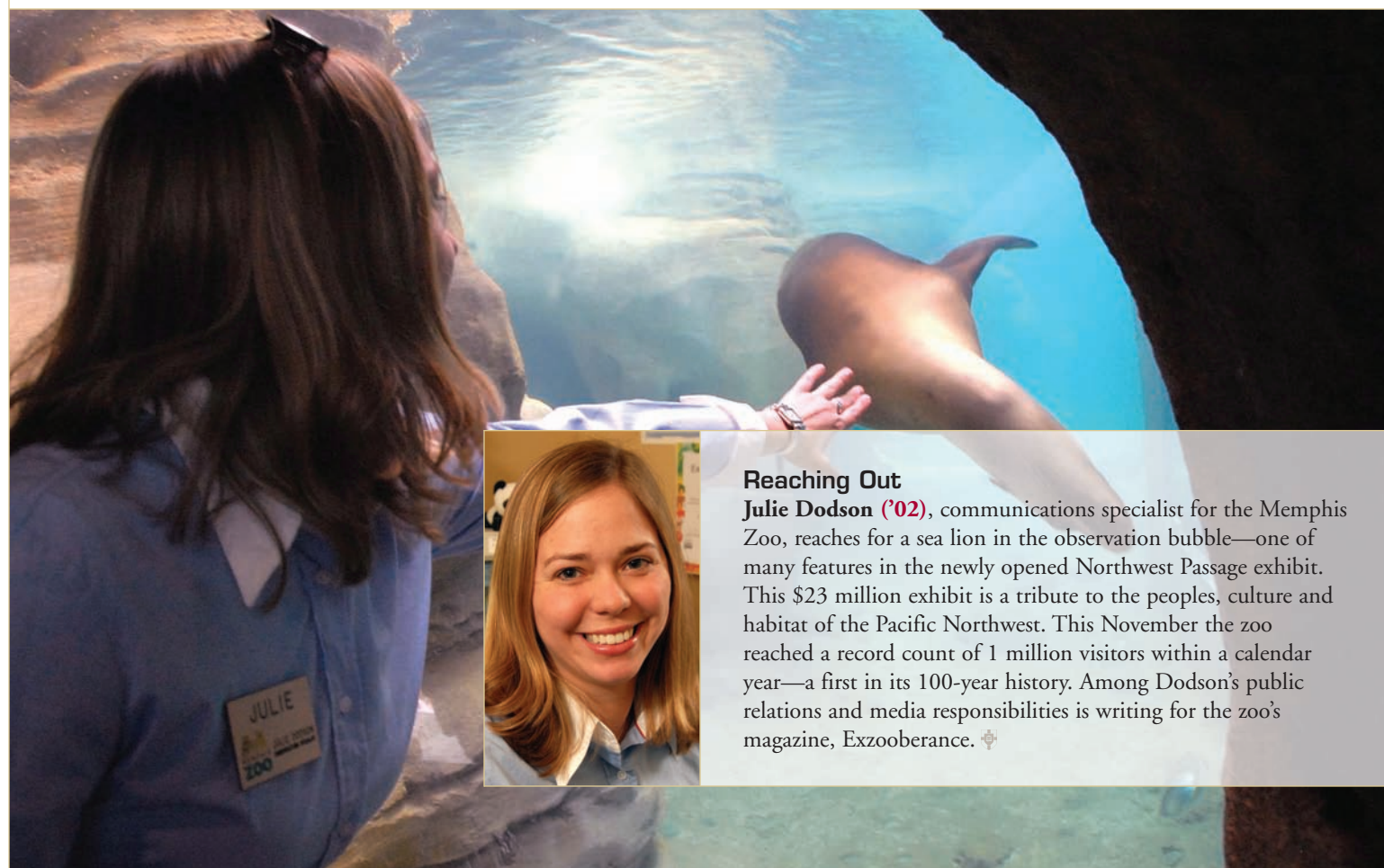
